

A WORLD OF CONRASTS

The Bible Readings set for today in the Old and New Testaments are about contrasts. Isaac and Esau: Twins can be identical; however these two were not, either physically or in personality.



The parable in the Gospel reading is about the ground on which seed was sown. Only one type of ground produced a good crop. The other types of soil were indifferent. St. Paul in his epistle to the Romans speaks of the contrasting life styles to be

found in the city where these Christians lived, and the challenges that it presented. One was hedonistic and egocentric whilst the other lifestyle was marked by liberation through faith in Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. Jesus left us in no doubt as to the reception that the Good News would receive at any time or place where it was proclaimed. There would be contrasts. Some would receive it in a positive way, others would reject it.

The challenge that lies before the Christian church today is to faithfully proclaim the Good News in Word and Deed. Actions do speak louder than words. Word and action need to be backed up by prayer.

It is the Holy Spirit that does God's work, supplying us with strength that is otherwise beyond our human ability.


A beautiful array of jams and marmalade are for sale and can be found on top of the cupboard in the foyer.
