

It is a lamentable and deeply inescapable fact that the pages of human history are indelibly stained by examples without number of the cruelty of mankind towards his neighbour. In our own time, surely, one of the

greatest stains on the human character was the case of Nelson Mandela, the freedom activist and politician, imprisoned for 27 years for his courageous opposition to South Africa's brutal and inhuman system of apartheid. 18 of his 27-years confinement were spent in the infamous prison on Robben



Island in a cell measuring 7 foot by 9 foot, the floor his bed, a bucket his toilet, a light burning overheard 24 hours a day, he was forced to do hard labour in a lime quarry and was allowed only one visitor a year for 30 minutes. He missed raising his children, was refused permission to attend the funerals of his mother and elder son, and had the added torment of knowing that his wife, Winnie, was held for 16 months in solitary confinement where she was tortured and beaten.

Sadly, history records too few instances of victims of political or religious oppression ever receiving the justice or vindication their martyrdom deserved. Nelson Mandela was one notable exception. By sheer force of will and drawing on the faith he gained from his early upbringing in the Methodist Church Mandela survived his incarceration. He emerged from the darkness into the light and went on *Continued on Page 3*

to become the first President of a democratic South Africa, a Nobel Peace Laureate and to be hailed as "Father of his Nation."

Rather than showing resentment towards his enemies on his release in 1990, Mandela, following Christ's example, forgave everyone as the only way forward. "As I walked out the door toward the gate that would lead to my freedom, I knew if I didn't leave my bitterness and hatred behind, I'd still be in prison." Romans 8:31-2 held a message for Nelson Mandela as it does for all of us: "If God is for us, who can be against us? Certainly not God, who did not even keep back his own son, but offered him for us all." And to God be the Glory.

Ministry in Placement – the Joint Nomination Committee (JNC) scheduled to meet Thursday 20 July.


City to Surf - 27 August 2023. The Worship Committee is very keen on arranging hospitality for the participants and their supporters in this event.

Book Review Rose by Suzanne Falkiner



Rose de Freycinet, the first woman to record her circumnavigation of the globe, including the west coast of Australia, was shipwrecked in the Falkland Islands in the closing stages of her three-year voyage with her husband Louis de Freycinet who captained the Uranie on a scientific mission. The French vessel arrived in Shark Bay on 12 September 1818.

Suzanne Falkiner, the author of our ladies bookclub book, *Rose*, was visiting Shark Bay when she learnt of Rose's remarkable journey at

a time when women were not allowed to travel on these scientific expeditions. She secured access to Rose's memoirs to write Rose's story.

While this book is full of historical facts Suzanne has managed to use the memoirs to write a fascinating story.
