#### SUNDAY 6 AUGUST 2023 - PENTECOST 10

This is the day of the 78th anniversary of the bombing of Hiroshima and the story of Sadako. Today in our opening part of worship, in the midst of the war in the UKRAINE and other places, we are reminded of the ever present call for peace. The story of the cranes is told by different writers such as Fred Small "Cranes over Hiroshima" but we



are reminded of the simple prayer of Sadako's mother and the very haunting song by Robin and Dorothy Mann.

This will be sung as part of our worship and the lighting of a candle with the two coloured

cranes of the Ukraine Yellow and Blue. Today the cranes are above the Communion Table as a reminder of the sign of peace that we express though the Eucharist in our lives.

In February 2022, when war in Ukraine began, the Archbishops of Canterbury and York wrote a prayer for the country and its people:

#### A Prayer for Ukraine

God of peace and justice,

we pray for the people of Ukraine today.

We pray for peace and the laying down of weapons.

We pray for all those who fear for tomorrow,

that your Spirit of comfort would draw near to them.

We pray for those with power over war or peace,

for wisdom, discernment and compassion to guide their decisions.

Above all, we pray for all your precious children, at risk and in fear, that you would hold and protect them.

On August 6th, 1945, the first atomic bomb was dropped, on the Japanese city of Hiroshima. 'Sadako And The Thousand Paper Crane', a book by Eleanor Coerr, tells the story of a 2 year old girl called Sadako, who survived the bomb, apparently unscathed, along with her family. When she was 11 years old, however, she became ill with a form of radiation illness. She had to go to hospital. Her best friend came to visit her with a gift. She brought Sadako a folded paper crane, and reminded her of an old Japanese belief: if a sick person made a thousand paper cranes and made a wish on each one, she would get better. Sadako made 642 before she died, but her friends and classmates made the rest and she was buried with a thousand paper cranes. Her statue is in Hiroshima Peace Park — she stands holding an origami crane — and it is her story that has made the folded paper crane a symbol of peace the world over. The song was inspired particularly by a short prayer that Sadako's mother whispers one night as she leaves the hospital bed where her daughter is sleeping: "O flock of heavenly cranes, cover my child with your wings

May a flock of cranes cover the world and peace be found everywhere







#### Second-Hand Laptops and or Tablets Needed for W Papua

Like many in the developing world, Papuans have limited internet access due to remoteness and/or cost. Therefore, RACHEL the "Remote Area Community Hotspot for Education and Learning" has been developed as a portable, battery-powered server containing a vast collection of educational content, including textbooks, videos, interactive lessons, and other materials. This means RACHEL can go anywhere in the world and wirelessly deliver free digital educational content to nearby tablets, laptops, or smartphones. RACHEL has been taken to over 53 countries since its creation, serving students in rural villages, townships, and even prisons. In Sierra Leone, students who used RACHEL for just four months increased their English literacy test scores by 67% more than those without RACHEL. Students can also learn many other subjects to increase their literacy overcoming problems of poverty, ill health, disease, poor nutrition and food scarcity.

Fred Bundah, following his recent Black Pearl visit to Perth returned with a RACHEL and is setting up a learning centre in Nabire, Papua. However, donations of laptops or tablets are needed so students can access the wealth of educational information on RACHEL.
