


Sustainability Economic Environment land."

The concern for sustainability burst onto the global scene 40 years ago when the first female Prime Minister of Norway, Gro Harlem Brundtland released the UN report: "Our Common Future", which popularized the term "sustainable development"

Of the Environmental, Social and Economic pillars of Sustainability, it is the economy which is most challenging, for as Mahatma Ghandhi said: "The world has enough for everyone's need, but not enough for everyone's greed." He went on: "Whether mankind will



consciously follow the law of love, I do not know. But that need not perturb us. The law will work, just as the law of gravitation will work whether we accept it or not. And now just as a scientist will work wonders out of various applications of the laws of nature, even so a man who applies the law of love with scientific precision can work great wonders."

Today's lectionary readings come from a time when the dominant concern was human violence. Now that violence extends to Mother Earth itself; and mother is none too pleased. Ancient wisdom places an obligation on all of us to meet our needs without compromising the ability of future generations to meet theirs - material and spiritual, as an act of love. **Richard Smith**
