Saints come in all shapes and sizes. Sometimes you may have known them for a very long time without realising how well they fit into that category. Such was the case with Willi Msiren.

I have known Willi since 2017 when he came to Perth for the APCEP



course and stayed with Ian and Amanda
Brown. He was employed by the Black Pearl
Papua Foundation (BPPF – the Papuan arm of
BPN) to teach in the very isolated Black Pearl
English Centre (BPEC) of Apawer, two hours
rough driving from the town of Sarmi. Since he
started there I had become a little irritated by
his scarce responses to emails and phone calls
and general poor communication.

Last week I travelled to Apawer to encourage Willi's class and to take teaching

resources and moral support from BPN. The trip west took over eight hours along a rough and winding road from Jayapura.

Close to the end of the road we collected Willi from the village of Niwerawa, an hours walk from Apawer, a road that Willi walks twice a day every time he goes to Apawer to teach. There is only locally generated power in the village between 7pm and 6am every day.

Electrical equipment such as a phone charger, computer, photocopier, lights or speakers can't be used during the day unless they are battery powered. There is no internet connectivity and only occasional mobile phone coverage – it's best between midnight and 1am.

The klasis (presbytery) office helps Willi with photocopying for his class if he happens to be there when the power is on. Otherwise he uses his own meagre teaching resources.


After meeting Willi and discussing his needs for his classes, the BPN is determined to get more resources to him, in the form of books, a laminator and stationery supplies. Not least we will somehow supply him with a RACHEL (Remote Area Communication Hub for Electronic Learning) to give him what he needs to resource his students and also to coincidentally begin to teach the children computer skills which they are completely lacking at present. Along with RACHEL we will need to provide electronic tablets to allow the children to access the precious learning materials it will bring to them. He already has a good laptop kindly gifted to him by his Australian hosts but a rechargeable battery powered speaker would allow him to use more of the resources it holds. With a laminator he could make charts and flashcards.

Willi has never once complained about his working conditions but he was quick to reassure me that he knows all of the people in those two small villages and he says that they are very hospitable and have welcomed him warmly into their community. His goal every day is to teach the children English, to make it fun and to install in them the confidence to use it.

What a saint!

Let us pray for the peace and communion of the whole human race and for the wholeness of every human being in loving relationship with God and neighbour



Ladies Book Club Review The Beekeeper of Aleppo by Christy Lefteri



Nuri is a beekeeper and his wife, Afra, an artist. They enjoy life in the beautiful Syrian city of Aleppo until there was no other option for them than to flee the country. Afra had witnessed something so terrible that she has gone blind.

They embark on a perilous journey through Turkey and Greece towards an uncertain future in Britain. In each part of the journey, they are awakened to dangers in their efforts to keep safe. Meeting their health needs, shelter and food is a continuous issue

while they also have to determine who they can believe and who they can trust. While Nuri has to care for his blind wife he also struggles with realistic illusions of his lost life.

This is a beautifully written, compassionate story from a writer who is the daughter of Cypriot refugees. She grew up in London, worked as a volunteer at a UNICEF supported refugee centre in Athens and is a lecturer in creative writing in Brunel University, London.

Through reading this one comes away with a greater understanding and deeper insight into the plight of refugees.
