Have you ever done a puzzle, trying to fit the pieces together? Each piece adds to and helps to reveal one complete picture.

God used many different Old Testament people - each one a piece in the puzzle – to help to reveal Christ. These people show us glimpses of Christ. But they were all

imperfect – obviously very different from Christ. Just like a piece of jigsaw, no single person, could adequately show us what Christ would be like.

How could such inadequate people reflect one who is far greater than any of them?

How can these Old Testament people – pieces in the puzzle – build a picture of Christ that we can understand and enjoy?

What have we learned about Christ and these historical figures?

<u>Adam</u> – Like Adam, Christ represented humanity. Through Adam, sin, death and judgement came to all humans. Through Christ, grace, life and righteousness come to everyone who believes in Him.

Are we trapped forever because of Adam's sin and our own sin? No. We do not need to be trapped. Christ sets believers free! Let's live as free people and willingly serve our great God.

OUR CHURCH LIFE

<u>Noah</u> – Through Noah, God showed that He could bring salvation in the midst of sin and judgement, God offers a greater salvation through Christ. Just as in Noah's time, if people today reject God's way of salvation, then judgement – though delayed – will be inevitable.

God has provided the way out. Let's put our faith in Christ, and tell others how they can also be free from the threat of judgement.

David was the ideal standard by which other kings were judged. But even though David was a man after God's own heart, he still sinned. King after king failed. Their failure pointed to the need for the perfect king – Jesus Christ.

How do we let Jesus rule as King in our lives?

<u>Melchizedek</u> enriches our understanding of Christ as the prince of peace, the King of righteousness and our great eternal high priest.

Praise God that the King of the universe cares about us individually. We can have confidence that Christ, our great high priest, represents us before the Father.

Jonah was as good as dead for three days. When Jewish leaders demanded a sign, Jesus said they would only get the sign of Jonah – Jesus would be in the grave three days, then raised to life! Jonah's experience hinted at something far greater – Christ's physical resurrection.

Jesus' resurrection was a sure sign of who He is. And it shows that believers will also rise to new life with God forever. We can face the future, and especially death, with quiet confidence, knowing Jesus has gone before us.

<u>Moses</u> – God spoke through His prophet Moses to the ancient Israelites. God revealed Himself and His will through Moses. Israel was to listen. Many centuries later, God made Himself known through Jesus, and Jesus spoke God's word. God said, "Listen to Him!" *Continued on page 3*
