Our local prayers will be for Open House Playgroup.


Your special offering next week and throughout December will go to Christmas Bowl

Volunteers needed for Live Streaming in 2024

Would you like to join All Saints UC Live Streaming team for 2024?

Live Streaming of worship, ordinations, inductions, and funerals has been a feature since COVID struck in 2021 and a Live Steaming system was installed for the public broadcast via the internet of All Saints UC's services through its Floreat UC YouTube channel (https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCbutwZFT34OewmTd5f4hCsw).

Since children can view the content, no on-line public comment is permitted.

What use is being made of our Live Streaming by others?

Several UC Congregations and retirement homes use the Live Stream from All Saints Uniting Church, Floreat as part of their own worship services. Over the last four weeks we have had 405 views with a total viewing time of 80.5 hours. Typically, half the views will be while the service is happening and the other half will be during the week. In this later phase people can scroll through to the parts they wish to view so saving time or pausing for a cup of tea or discussion.

What is involved in doing the Live Streaming?

The person Live Streaming is making a video production of the service by choosing in real time between several pre-set Camera views - the Screen or Camera view, the Screen plus Camera view or the Screen alone view. Simultaneously there are the audio channels for the various microphones and for the image being projected to the screen. Each channel is set to ON or MUTE as well as sound level. A key part of the process is connecting via the internet to our YouTube channel.

What happens to the Live Stream?

As a Live Stream is being created on YouTube a video copy is being recorded to a USB on our system.

The real time Live Stream is archived automatically by YouTube but is not available for editing or download until some hours later. Therefore for immediate later viewing the USB copy is uploaded to YouTube to which is added a full description of the event, the key persons participating and a lectionary thumbnail to advertise to a wider audience the event via email, Facebook or web site.
