APCEP

Australian Papuan Cultural Exchange Program (APCEP)

This weekend is the beginning of the 7th Australian Papuan Cultural Exchange Program (APCEP). I am keen to introduce Anne Batorinding from Manokwari and Yunus Elopore from Wamena. They arrived in Perth on Friday and are staying with two families from Trinity North Uniting Church who have long been our close partners in this project. They will

attend English classes at the Milner

International College of English where they are the recipients of scholarships to cover all their educational costs for the next twelve weeks. This partnership has allowed the APCEP course to continue even in the face of serious funding cuts which have curtailed other Black Pearl Network (BPN) projects. Other costs of their visit to Perth

will be covered by donations from our churches. Through projects like this one, our local churches have been drawn into close partnerships and are constantly discovering the benefits and rewards of working together towards a shared goal.

This week, and throughout February, our retiring offering will go to the work of the Black Pearl Network and will allow us to continue to develop a high level of English teaching in the Black Pearl English Centres (BPEC), of which we now run 17, spread all over the Papuan provinces. The introduction of low fees for these courses is slowly moving the program towards being self-sustaining. Anne and Yunus have both been selected from these centres.

The Vocational Training Programme in hospitality and tourism will also be supported by our donations, including scholarships for four Papuan students currently studying at a university in Bali to prepare them to take up teaching positions in this programme. The First Flush Clean Water Program (FFS), which is now developing close partnerships with three universities in the Papuan provinces, is also working towards being a self-sustaining project with benefits to be delivered to villages all over Papuan Indonesia. The university students will plan and execute FFS projects as a part of their undergraduate studies in engineering, forestry and other related disciplines, under the guidance of BPN staff.

Projects in the Papuan provinces are constantly developing and changing as we and our Papuan partners adapt to changing economic and local conditions but with your support we will strive to meet the challenges of working with our close neighbours for our mutual benefit.
