Why Do We Have the Old Testament?

In our Lenten study on Grace this week, one of the questions was "How important to your faith is the bigger story of God's relationship with humanity as presented to us in the Old Testament?"

One example is Marcion of Sinope who is attributed with recording the earliest canon for Christianity in 144 CE. But he didn't include the Old Testament. Instead, he only included a shortened version of Luke, and 10 Pauline epistles. Marcionites held that the God of the Hebrew Bible was inconsistent with their beliefs of Jesus Christ and so denounced it. Marcionism was eventually denounced as heresy and so we have our much longer Bibles as we know them today.

What the Marcionites demonstrate is that the relationship between the Old and New Testaments should not be taken for granted. It is not uncommon to find Christians today who prioritise the New Testament and might suggest the Old Testament is irrelevant. Some scholars have suggested that the names 'Old' and 'New' contribute to this perception and have suggested using First and Second Testaments.

For me, the Old Testament is a treasure. It has stories of beliefs about the beginnings. It has histories of the early Israel Kingdom. It has the cries and laments during times of suffering. It has poetry, hymns, prophecies, and more. The Old Testament wonderfully complements the New Testament and grounds our faith in a history of God's activity from the beginning of time.

How important is the Old Testament to you and your faith?
