

# **Baptised Members**

Today we are excited to welcome the Malloch family to church so that 4-year-old Arthur can be baptised into the Uniting Church family like his brother, father, uncle, and grandmother. Once Arthur is baptised he will immediately become a member of this congregation.



In the Uniting Church in Australia regulations, we have four different memberships. The most common are our confirmed members. These are people who have been baptised and confirmed in the UCA (or transferred from another denomination) and are full voting members of the congregation and can be elected as Elders or Church Councillors. Most people at All Saints are confirmed members.

Members-in-Association are those people who want to retain their membership in another denomination and also join our congregation or are active members of two UCA congregations. They are also full voting members of the church.

Adherents are those people who are not baptised but wish to be associated with the church and receive its care. Adherents are not able to vote or join Elders or church council. Finally, we have our Baptised Members. These are children who are baptised in our church but are not old enough to be confirmed at the time of their baptism. They also cannot vote or join elders or church council. However, they are members of our congregation.

# Getting to Know You Michiko and Barry Stuart



Barry, born and raised in Cheshire, England, was brought to Australia in 1964 by his mother with two brothers and a sister. They spent two years at the Fairbridge Farm School near Pinjarra. In the late 1960's Barry studied at UWA and Claremont Teachers' College then taught in North Lake, Bayswater and

Mullewa. He lived in New Zealand in 1975 and in Tokyo for three years in the late 1970's, teaching methodology to prospective English teachers. On his return to Australia, he was appointed Manager of the Adult Migrant Education Program which provided English language courses for migrants and refugees. **Barry** completed a degree in history in the late 1980's. He also speaks competent Japanese.

**Michiko** was born and brought up in a village near Fukuoka city in south-west Japan. She came to Perth in 1987 to study English and complete post-graduate studies in Graduate Diploma, Addiction at Curtin University. She and Barry met through a mutual friend and were married on 22<sup>nd</sup> May 1989. They have lived in Floreat since then, apart from five years in their cottage in Dwellingup from 2017 until they returned to Perth in 2022 and retired.

**Michiko** and **Barry** have two children. Amy lives in Melbourne where she is a visual artist and a teacher at Monash University. Gordon works for the Department of Defence in Canberra.

# A Meaningful Celebration of Lent and Easter Day Some thoughts from Lillian.

Lent and Easter this year included some extra features which I particularly appreciated. We marked the beginning of Lent with a Pancake Tuesday morning tea – something we might further develop next year– and an Ash Wednesday service, which I found particularly moving. Then, throughout Lent we concentrated on the theme of God's "unbounded love" using phrases from Charles Wesley's hymn 'Love divine all love excelling'. I also had fun learning to make Palm Crosses for Palm Sunday.

Perhaps, though, the most significant addition was the Maundy Thursday evening service (actually at 5pm to suit us older members of the congregation). It is a long time since I have been to a Maundy Thursday Service. This service was really a reenactment of Jesus' last supper with his disciples and I found it a very special way of participating in the journey of Christ to the Cross. Somehow communion seemed much more significant because of the reminder of the whole context of the meal and the imminent betrayal by Judas.

On Friday morning we heard Mark's version of the drama of Friday, from Jesus praying in the Mount of Olives, his arrest and trial, leading to the crucifixion. We went home as Jesus was laid in the tomb and the stone sealed the tomb. What a significant way to be reminded of the trauma of the story even though we knew that this was not the end of it.

Then on Sunday morning we started the day able to sing with enthusiasm 'Christ the Lord is risen today' as we joined the large congregation gathered to celebrate a joyous Easter Day.

Preparing for Easter this year was, for me, enhanced by the additions to our regular schedule of services and activities. If you missed out this year on any parts of the story then perhaps you can plan to share in them with us next year. We now enjoy the Easter season and prepare for the coming of the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

# Hearing Aid Loop

All Saints Floreat has a hearing aid loop in the Church Sanctuary.

There are pews with the hearing aid loop sign on the end. If you sit in these rows, the loop will work more effectively.

The hearing loop may not work as well if you're on the border of the room.

Turn your hearing aid to the "T" setting. T stands for "telecoil" which translates the signal from the loop into audio in your hearing aid.

There were about 60 enthusiastic and appreciative followers in attendance too (averaging about 43 each Sunday). Well worth the \$12 admission fee which included afternoon tea! Sadly, this was the last concert to be conducted by the Jackadder's Music Club.

After 20 years of presenting both established and up and coming artists, many of whom have gone on to form duos and bands after meeting likeminded musicians at the Club, Carmel the Coordinator has had to step down from her role. Unfortunately, there are no volunteers to take on the continued running of the Club and hence this article.

The main aims on establishing the Jackadder's Music Club were to:

- Give young audiences the opportunity to experience quality traditional and contemporary folk music.
- Promote live music, develop performing skills and provide encouragement.
