NEWS & NOTES SUNDAY 14 APRIL 2024 - EASTER 3

1 John

During the Easter season for this year the Revised Common Lectionary (RCL), that is used by churches all over the globe and All Saints, includes a reading from 1 John each week. So, this year we are going to focus on the first letter of John as we reflect on Christ's resurrection each week during the Easter season. With this focus in mind, I thought it would be great to let you know a bit of background on first John. 1 John is the first of three Johannine epistles included in the New Testament. The author of the epistle is unknown (they don't introduce themselves in the letter). Some scholars have argued it is the same John who authored the gospel and was Jesus's disciple. Others argue it is a disciple of John's like the second and third letters of John which are attributed to the Elder. The letter is likely written in Ephesus between 95 and 110 CE.

After initial expectations that Jesus would return quickly, communities began to grapple with life as a follower of Jesus and divisions began in some of the church communities. It appears from the letter that some disillusioned believers have left the communities claiming Jesus was never the Messiah or God. In response we have 1 John, steeped in the theology and tradition of the gospel of John and more of a sermon than a letter, which seeks to remind the followers of Christ about who Jesus is and the love of God.

Hearing Aid Loop All Saints Floreat has a hearing aid loop in the Church Sanctuary.

There are pews with the hearing aid loop sign on the end. If you sit in these rows, the loop will work more effectively.

The hearing loop may not work as well if you're on the border of the room. Turn your hearing aid to the "T" setting. T stands for "telecoil" which translates the signal from the loop into audio in your hearing aid.

A Word About Your Church Offering

With the return of the collection being taken in the pews each week it is timely to remind everyone of the two ways that your offering can be made to All Saints.

The preferred method is via your bank as a regular EFT. The church bank account details are:

By using this method there are many advantages These include ensuring a regular flow of funds to assist the congregation in meeting our budgeted expenses for our own running costs, wages and our Mission and Service contribution for the work of the wider Uniting church. Payment by EFT also means less cash for our volunteers to handle, count and bank each week, which with the closure of our local branch means travel further afield. The disadvantage is that sometimes we set up our EFT payments and forget about them which means that, we do not review and adjust them.

Alternatively, the weekly collection in the pews is available for those who are unable to use the EFT system for any reason, visitors who are not familiar with our online method and, to boost your giving if you haven't increased your regular EFT in the way that you may intend to.

As you will recall, at the AGM I took the opportunity to ask all our members to review their regular giving and to consider increasing the amount by around 5% to meet our budget. If you have not yet done so I would ask that you prayerfully consider your giving to All Saints.

KYB (KNOW YOUR BIBLE)



Floreat UC CLC in Action – Caring for Creation



A project of Floreat UC CLC is **Caring for Creation** by the recycling of goods for Good Sammy's and Paraquad Industries, providing employment for disabled persons. Also, by **Containers for Change** to support work of the Boab and Black Pearl Networks helping indigenous

peoples of W Papua, Indonesia and NW Kimberley. With the assistance of Wembley Downs and Trinity North Uniting Churches and many volunteers our Containers for Change total this Easter passed \$12,000.

Greater, but hidden, are the contributions towards achieving net zero emissions to counter global warming. For example, emissions from energy use are reduced by 95% by recycling aluminium and 50% for glass. Reduced mining of bauxite needed for aluminium production saves many hectares of jarrah forests in the Darling Ranges. Forests vital for extracting heat warming CO₂ from the atmosphere. Reduction of land fill from plastics saves our waters from being polluted and nano plastics entering the food chain and our bodies. Recycled cardboard saves forests from being cleared and water being used for its manufacturing.

Mother Nature has achieved a remarkable diversity of life over 3.8 billion years of evolution which we are now blessed to enjoy. Since the resources of Earth are finite, Mother Nature has achieved this by recycling everything. We are now beginning to learn that such recycling is part of our sacred duty if we are to live sustainably on this fragile planet we call home.

Election of Lay Synod Representatives

At the meeting of Presbytery to be held on 1 June, Presbytery will be electing members of the Synod meeting to be held on September 13-15 this year (usually there is opening worship on Friday evening followed by all day meetings on the Saturday and Sunday at one of our schools and is fully catered). The Synod meeting is an important annual meeting that sets directions and priorities for the year and will discuss and decide on a range of proposals.

A large number of confirmed lay members of the Uniting Church need to be elected to be lay members of Synod. This election will take place at the Presbytery meeting on June 15.

You do not need to be a lay member of Presbytery to be elected as a lay member of Synod. Congregations can nominate confirmed members who are not members of Presbytery for this election (we could nominate the whole congregation!). All Saints will pay for the cost of attendance.


