Thursdays in Black



In Australia there has been an increase in the number of deaths of women due to violence and this is no more apparent than in our local community. Two innocent women died just ten houses from our church just two weeks ago. Since then a Byford woman has died due to domestic violence and a Gooseberry Hill woman is in a critical

condition. This violence is out of control. How can we speak up?

One opportunity is to participate in the Thursdays in Black campaign. Led by the World Council of Churches, Thursdays in Black is an ecumenical campaign that encourages people to speak out against all forms of gender-based violence. People participate by wearing black on Thursdays as a symbol of strength and resistance. As well raising voices, the campaign aims to uncover the root causes of gender-based violence and to identify misinterpretations of the bible and theology that have led to gender inequality. The current President of the UCA, Rev Sharon Hollis and the immediate past Assembly General Secretary Colleen Geyer, are ambassadors for the campaign.

Election of Lay Synod Representatives

At the meeting of Presbytery to be held on 1 June, Presbytery will be electing members of the Synod meeting to be held on September 13-15 this year (usually there is opening worship on Friday evening followed by all day meetings on the Saturday and Sunday at one of our schools and is fully catered). The Synod meeting is an important annual meeting that sets directions and priorities for the year and will discuss and decide on a range of proposals.

A large number of confirmed lay members of the Uniting Church need to be elected to be lay members of Synod. This election will take place at the Presbytery meeting on June 15.

You do not need to be a lay member of Presbytery to be elected as a lay member of Synod. Congregations can nominate confirmed members who are not members of Presbytery for this election (we could nominate the whole congregation!). All Saints will pay for the cost of attendance.

Two members of our congregation, Babs Tuzee and Margaret Wolfe, who regularly volunteer at the Breakfast Club at Lake Monger Primary School were awarded a certificate of recognition from Food Bank recently.

The Lake Monger Breakfast Program started in 2010 when the Thursday Fellowship was doing the Floral Carpet display. Lana Dobrow, the Lake Monger Primary School chaplain at the time, brought to the church's attention the need for breakfast nutrition for children of families whose circumstances were less than ideal, particularly migrant and refugees at the Lake Monger Primary School. The school has a current enrolment of 332 students with around 75 percent speaking a language other than English at home.

The program began in 2010 with Lana's support and the backing of the Fellowship Group. The Fellowship Group was headed by Amanda Brown, who worked tirelessly to make this program so successful. The program runs

every Wednesday morning during term time and around 50 students are provided with nutrition on those Wednesdays. We offer cheese toasties, spaghetti and Milo drinks.

The long-time co-ordinator, Pamela van der Meulen (who happens to be the President of the YouthCare Committee) is stepping down from that role but will continue to help out on Wednesdays. Babs Tuzee and Margaret Wolfe have been joined by Coral Lalich, who will help out when needed, so this important but less well-known outreach activity of All Saints Floreat can continue. The dedication of both Babs and Margaret to this important programme has been acknowledged by Food Bank with the 2023 School Breakfast Program Volunteer Award.
