Multifaith Week of Climate Action



On Tuesday the 17th of September Uniting Church leaders and communities were among those making a stand for climate justice and climate action as part of the Multifaith Week of

Action organised by the Australian Religious Response to Climate Change (ARRCC).

St. Mary's raised their banner calling for stronger climate action and invited faith leaders to join. You can see several pictured including Rev Hollis Wilson and Rev Ken Devereaux from the Uniting Church. They joined First Nations leaders and leaders from the Jewish, Muslim, Buddhist, Catholic, Anglican, Quaker, Hindu and Bahá'í traditions at events around Australia.

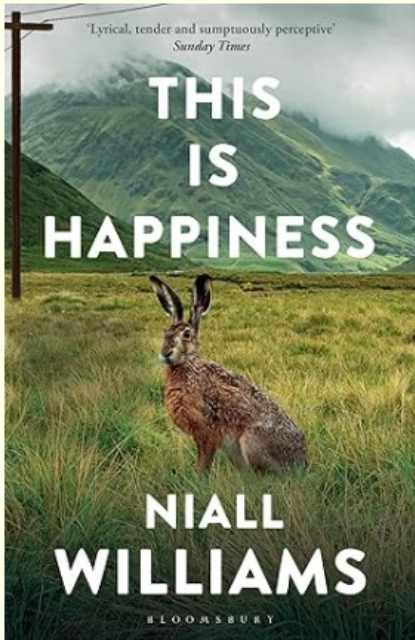

Book Review



This is Happiness by Niall Williams

This is Happiness, the Ladies Bookclub book for September, generated a range of responses from the members. We ranked the book from 1 – 10 with the average of the rankings being 4.5. There was a wide range of opinions about the content. However there was a lively discussion especially as some of the more amusing sections of the book were highlighted. Some of the comments included: Superb writing, Very evocative, Bit slow in parts, Lacked a good plot.

The story is set in 1958 in Faha a small Irish parish where electricity is being introduced. The narrator, Noel known as Noe, is remembering the events of 60+ years ago when Christy McMahon arrived in the town as part of the electrification project and over time reveals the reason he has returned. Noe has dropped out of the seminary and has moved in with his grandparents. Noe develops hopeless crushes on the three daughters of the local doctor. Meanwhile Christy is seeking to right a wrong with Annie the local chemist. Noe and Christy have a number of adventures when bike riding and when they visit pubs looking for a particular musician.

occasion as we were celebrating Jessie’s 80th birthday.

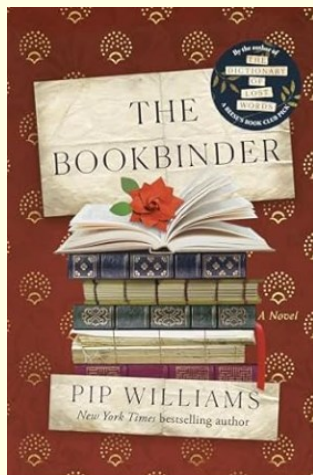


Although our numbers were small due to some members being unwell, we had a very happy afternoon together and Jessie cut her beautiful cake made by Cathy Smith.

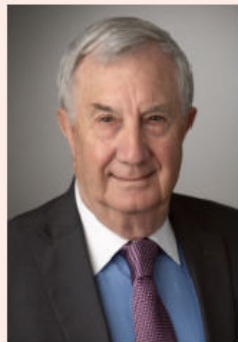
