

Book Review



This is Happiness by Niall Williams

This is Happiness, the Ladies Bookclub book for September, generated a range of responses from the members. We ranked the book from 1 – 10 with the average of the rankings being 4.5. There was a wide range of opinions about the content. However there was a lively discussion especially as some of the more amusing sections of the book were highlighted. Some of the comments included: Superb writing, Very evocative, Bit slow in parts, Lacked a good plot.

The story is set in 1958 in Faha a small Irish parish where electricity is being introduced. The narrator, Noel known as Noe, is remembering the events of 60+ years ago when Christy McMahon arrived in the town as part of the electrification project and over time reveals the reason he has returned. Noe has dropped out of the seminary and has moved in with his grandparents. Noe develops hopeless crushes on the three daughters of the local doctor. Meanwhile Christy is seeking to right a wrong with Annie the local chemist. Noe and Christy have a number of adventures when bike riding and when they visit pubs looking for a particular musician.

On Saturday afternoon 7th September Deborah Marshall's Friendship Group met at Jessie Duffield's home in Wembley Downs. This was a special




Although our numbers were small due to some members being
