

One Body, One Wine, One Bread



Communion, the Lord's Supper, the Eucharist, is one of only two sacraments in the Uniting Church in Australia. It is the incredible special ritual in which we believe the very real presence of Christ invites us to his table to share in a meal. In many traditions and places around the world this meal can vary. At an Anglican church I attend the meal has a large wafer broken into segments and one cup of fortified wine to share. I have also attended a Pentecostal church where the meal was pre-packaged for you to collect on the way into the service. In the Uniting Church there is also variation. Most serve non-alcoholic grape juice to be inclusive, but some like Margaret River Uniting Church also provide a wine option. Many Uniting Churches also use a large crusty loaf of bread, even if it means crumbs might go astray.

Here at All Saints the Elders and I have spoken often about communion. We talked about the challenges of distribution and made changes to give an opportunity for us all to physically respond to Christ's invitation to the meal. We talked about who is invited to serve communion and have sought to invite a range of congregation members to participate in this ministry. *Continued on Page 4*

Recently we have had further discussions about the elements we use for communion. During the great prayer of thanksgiving, I say the following "shape us into one body; press us into one wine; bake us into one bread – the Bread of Life and Cup of Freedom." One of the powerful parts of our sacrament is the fellowship we experience together. We come together as one family, one congregation, one community of disciples of Christ to share in a meal with one cup and one bread.

With Methodist roots and a strong desire to be inclusive of children and those who do not wish to drink alcohol, we use non-alcoholic grape juice and as such it is not safe for us to drink from a single cup. However, for the bread we have an opportunity to share one loaf. Since starting at All Saints, I have always used the one loaf of bread on the table to serve the stewards and ushers but after a discussion with the Elders we have agreed to use one large loaf of bread for the entire congregation, starting next month. We hope this will give you a greater sense of connection and fellowship with your All Saints family during this meal.

The Elders and I would welcome your thoughts and any reflections on how this change impacts your experience of communion.


Do you like to bake bread?


Memorial Service for the Late Rev Ken Melville
