Kids Hope 20th Anniversary

On Sunday 20th October Amanda Brown, Ruth White & Rhondda Tilbrook attended a celebration of 20 years of Kids Hope at The Rocks Church in Cannington. The program

has been running in WA for 17 years and All Saints is one of the longer term participants in the program.

We were welcomed to the celebration by Tim Smith, Community Engagement Officer for Kids Hope. We watched a video welcome from Rev Tim Costello who has been Patron of Kids Hope since its inception. We also heard via video from the lady who introduced the idea of the Kids Hope program to World Vision. She is still in contact with the young lady she mentored many years ago and has attended a number of significant events in the girl's life.

Simon Warrick, CEO, spoke about the work of Kids Hope and some of the successes of the program in the lives of young people. He also spoke about their hopes for the future. Currently there is a Kids Hope program in 183 schools (20 in WA) with approximately 1000 mentors. The dream is to be able to provide a mentor for every child who needs one.

During afternoon tea we talked with other mentors including two ladies who are mentoring at Jolimont Primary. We also learned more about The Rocks Church. Their auditorium could seat approximately 3000 people. The celebration ended with cutting the celebration cake and a group photo. All attendees were given a fridge magnet (pictured above).

Breakfast Club at Lake Monger Primary School



The Lake Monger Breakfast Program started in 2010 when the Thursday Fellowship was doing the Floral Carpet display. Lana Dobrow, the Lake Monger Primary School chaplain at the time, brought to the church's attention the need for breakfast nutrition for children of families whose circumstances were less than ideal, particularly migrant and refugees at the Lake Monger Primary School. The school has a current enrolment of 332 students with around 75 percent speaking a language other than English at home. The program began in 2010 with Lana's support and the backing of the Fellowship Group. The Fellowship Group was headed by Amanda Brown, who worked tirelessly to make this program so successful. The program runs every Wednesday morning during term time and around 50 students are provided with nutrition on those Wednesdays. We offer cheese toasties, spaghetti and Milo drinks

Our group of volunteers includes Pamela van der Meulen (she is currently President of the Youth Care Committee), Babs Tuzee, Margaret Wolfe and, when needed, Coral Lalich. We enjoy helping to support the students and have been acknowledged by Food Bank with the 2023 School Breakfast Program Volunteer Award. On Wednesday October 16, the Federal member for Curtin, Kate Chaney, made a surprise visit to the school. She was very interested in learning about our program. We were able to make her aware that it is an outreach initiative of All Saints. The school principal, Diane Tomlinson, is very supportive of the program as are other staff members. They make us feel very welcome and it is a pleasure to be part of the program. We enjoy interacting with the children who are very polite and thankful.
