A New Lectionary Year

This Sunday marks the beginning of Advent and the beginning of a new church year. We will begin Year C, which focuses on the Gospel of Luke. In the newly released Uniting Church in Australia Lectionary resource, the President of the Uniting Church, Rev Chariss Suli, introduces the Gospel of Luke. "The Gospel of Luke invites us into a unique and profoundly compassionate vision of Christ's ministry — a vision that speaks especially to the lost, the marginalised, and the least among us. This gospel highlights a Jesus anointed by the Spirit to bring good news to the poor, proclaim release to captives, recovery of sight to the blind, and to set the oppressed free (Lk 4:18-19). In Luke, we see Jesus fulfilling a radical mission of liberation, with salvation woven through as an inclusive hope for all people.

Luke's narrative also offers a unique space for women, lifting up their voices and experiences in ways unseen in other gospels. Mary, Elizabeth and Anna take central roles in the story of Jesus' birth and early ministry. Through Mary's prophetic song—the Magnificat—we hear the cry for justice and liberation resound as she proclaims a God who scatters the proud and exalts the humble, a truth that echoes through the ages.



Book Review



Peace is Her Song: The life and legacy of hymn writer Shirley Erena Murray by Anne Manchester pp338. Phillip Garside Publishing Ltd.

A truly stimulating book by noted journalist and writer Ann Manchester about New Zealand hymn writer Shirely Erean Murray (1931 – 2020) whose hymns have significantly influenced contemporary church music.

Raised a Methodist, she became a Presbyterian on marrying Rev John Stewart Murray, who with

Shirley's help took St Andrews on the Terrace in Wellington on the verge of closure to becoming a hub for music, progressive theology, social action, including the anti-apartheid movement, racial equality and the integrity of creation. Sir Lloyd Geering played a significant role where he served as an honorary assistant minister and lecturer, contributing to the church's focus on contemporary theological thought and community engagement.

Only a couple of Shirely Murray's hymns are included in our *Together in Song: Australian Hymn Book* used extensively in the Uniting Church. In contrast her hymns are included in more than **140 collections** worldwide, particularly in North America. Murray's approach to hymn writing emphasized the importance of singing as an expression of belief, famously stating: "If you don't sing it, you don't believe it". Her hymns serve not only as expressions of faith but also as calls to action for justice, peace within communities and care of creation.

Teddy bears from Floreat with love

The clever knitters at All Saints Floreat Uniting Church have been applying their talents to ease the stress of kids in hospital.

In September church members Heather Booth and Carol Brearley decided to make teddy bears to give to children admitted to hospital.

Their decision followed a talk given by child and adolescent health service volunteer coordinator Andy Wahid about the role of Perth Children's Hospital volunteers.

He said some volunteers had donated articles to help distract children from the trauma of the incident that led to their hospital visit.

So Heather and Carol, who at-

tend All Saints Floreat Uniting Church, decided to create trauma teddies to be given to kids in hospital as a cuddly way to distract them from their traumatic experience.

They spread the word and it has become a real team effort.

Heather, a former nurse, said the women had made more than 200 of the teddies so far, using leftover wool they had in their cupboards, and donations.

They each contributed their bit to each teddy: some knitted, some sewed, some stuffed the bears and others added the trimmings that made each bear unique.

Each one is finished off with a small tag with the words "Hand made with Love" and "Floreat Uniting Church", before being packed into a cellophane bag with washing instructions.

Heather said she stuffed the bears while she watched Antiques Roadshow on TV.

"We all said 'If I can be useful, I'd like to be useful'," she said.

"We took them to church to be blessed by our minister. It's all been very positive."

Perth Children's Hospital volunteers use their training and discretion to give out a teddy bear to calm an anxious child who might be waiting for emergency treatment, having ongoing treatment, or attending the immunisation clinic.

Siblings are considered also, because they can be apprehensive about visiting hospital.
