Friendship Group News


Our friendship group met at the home of Anne and Michael van Drunen recently.



Book Review



Go as a River by Shelley Read is based on events which happened around the town of Iola, Colorado. It was a small but thriving farming and ranching community along the Gunnison River, serviced by a spur of the Denver & Rio Grande narrow-gauge railroad. When the Colorado River Storage Project was authorized by the US Bureau of Reclamation in 1956, the fate of the Gunnison River and the Iola Basin was sealed: the entire 23-mile stretch would be evacuated and the wild river dammed to create Blue Mesa Reservoir. By 1962 when the dam construction began, 200-300 inhabitants had

been displaced. The entire area was flooded in 1965, erasing Iola from the map. The town of Iola was largely forgotten, until, in 2018, a profound drought required a down-river water call on Blue Mesa Reservoir, draining the lake so low that the muddy remnants of Iola reemerged.

The story opens in post war rural Colorado, where societal nuances and expectations are followed unquestioned and there is a dark nonchalance to the community's inherent racism/bigotry and the whispered distancing of its populace from those who do not fit the mould. The people are aware of the plan to flood the area but are not in favour.

Victoria "Torie" Nash is 17 but was just 12 when she lost her mother. Left as the sole woman of the house, it's her job to cook for her father, brother and disabled uncle, keep the house and also help out on the family's peach farm. It's not an easy life – her brother is heading down a dangerous path, her father is somewhat distant, a tough man who doesn't seem to know how to parent his


daughter. And her uncle by marriage was injured in a war and now lives to be waited on, contributing little. When Torie meets charismatic Wilson Moon, she's helpless against his charm and easy going nature. Some of what happens is expected but eventually Victoria on the spur of the moment makes a heartbreaking decision that changes her life.

We are introduced to another remarkable woman, Inga Tate. Her life and plans have been up ended by a man, romance and a pregnancy but she has to adhere to acceptable societal expectations, she marries and has her child and coincidental circumstances, place her in the right place at the right time. The story which Inga writes about part of her life is a beautiful piece of writing.

Members of the Bookclub rated the book from 7 to 10 and the average score was 8.25. Comments included "beautiful writing", "I liked it", "I enjoyed the writing" and "very miserable".

Although there are some sad aspects to the story I would recommend the book for its beautiful writing and descriptions of the landscape in Colorado.
