'The Communion of Saints'



During this year we have had a baptism and two confirmations. At each service we as a community of believers have stood to recite the Apostle's creed. It is an ancient creed that speaks to the core beliefs of Christianity. In that creed we reach the final stanza and say "I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints..." But what does it

mean to believe in the communion of saints?

When people think of saints they might think of famous people who have been named an official saint, like St Paul, St Ignatius, or St Mary MacKillop. However long before this formal practice, the apostle's creed spoke of the saints as all believers through time and place. To believe in the communion of saints was to recognise the spiritual connection all Christians have with each other through their connection to Christ and the rituals we share. This connection is often found in some of our most important rituals, like baptism, confirmation and holy communion.

On Sunday the 3rd we will mark All Saints day where we remember the many people who have died and yet continue to be connected to us through the communion of saints. We will also celebrate holy communion. While many of the congregation have appreciated or warmed to the changes to how we receive communion some have mourned the loss of the sense of unity that eating and drinking at the

Everyone will still be invited to come forward and receive the elements but instead of consuming them on the spot you are invited to take them back to your seats and hold onto them until all have been served and then we can eat and drink together. We hope this will enable a greater sense of communion as we participate in this ancient ritual that has been practiced by our saints for millennia

A funeral service will be held at All Saints Floreat Uniting Church on Wednesday, 13 November 2024 at 2:00pm.






