March for Humanity

On Sunday the 3rd of August more than 90,000 people marched through the rain and cold over Sydney harbour bridge.



Two days earlier, the Uniting Church Assembly announced that it had adopted a statement of the World Council of Churches Central Committee on Palestine as the Uniting Church's official position. President Rev Charissa Suli says "with deep lament and righteous anger, the statement names the devastation in Gaza, the escalating violence in the West Bank and Jerusalem, and calls the global Church to action grounded in the Gospel of Jesus Christ and international law. It affirms the dignity of both Palestinians and Israelis and draws an essential distinction between our Jewish siblings and the policies of the Israeli Government. It unequivocally rejects all forms of racism, including antisemitism, anti-Arab racism and Islamophobia."

Crafting for Others Saturday 26th July 2025


It was another successful session of Crafting for Others.




