"The Uniting Church Assembly joins with many across Australia and around the world in mourning the passing and giving thanks for the life of Dorothy Joan ("Joan") Stott, who died peacefully on 9 July 2025 in Victoria.

Joan's life was marked by deep faith, servant leadership and a steadfast

commitment to the ministry of the Church. Her influence was felt locally in her beloved Geelong community, nationally through the Uniting Church Adult Fellowship (UCAF), and internationally through the World Federation of Methodist and Uniting Church Women. All were enriched by her enduring passions for the gifts of women and of older people."
