Dr Ming Wang's Life Mission

Earlier this year, while browsing through the list of books my kindle thought I'd like to read, I came across an autobiography entitled 'From Darkness to Sight - A Journey from Hardship to Healing' by

Ming Wang.



Ming Wang was born in 1960 in Hangzhou, Zhejiang, China during the Chinese Cultural Revolution - a time during which many young people were being deported to remote areas to face a life of poverty and hard labour.

As a teenager Ming Wang and his parents did whatever they could to avoid him being deported. When the Cultural Revolution eased, Ming Wang was able to continue his education in China, culminating in a scholarship to America to continue his studies. He had impressed a visiting American professor who facilitated his path to America. He earned a PhD in laser physics and graduated magna cum laude with the highest honors from Harvard Medical School and MIT. He also embraced the Christian faith and the relationship between Christianity and science.

Dr. Ming Wang is a world-renowned laser eye surgeon and philanthropist. He performed the world's first laser-assisted artificial cornea implantation.

The T-Shirts will cost \$35.00 each and will need to be ordered by 23 October 2025.



Reflections on 50 Years



My probationary year, and ordination year 1975 was spent as Chaplain at MLC, how Dr Hadley persuaded the Fathers' of the Methodist Conference to allow that I will never know. My ministry at MLC was only to be for one year as I became pregnant with my first child.

The next 8 years were a mixture of part time ministry at Wesley Church, 2 more babies, a period of living in Iraq and one year in supply at Wesley College

In my 10 years as chaplain at PLC the community experienced virtually every form of family tragedy possible. It was in some of the really rough times that I experienced the care of the staff, I felt wrapped in love. It wasn't all sad, bad and horrible; the staff room was a place of many celebrations, many cakes and lots of laughter. My junior school assemblies were a great source of joy.

From PLC I moved to RPH where I had some very happy years. Although I saw a lot of sadness, I had opportunity to get to know families and patients. The funerals, oh so many funerals, I think 7 in 10 days was my record! Amongst all the sadness there was also lots of laughter

If I have to put one word to my 50 years in ministry, it would be 'privilege'. Privilege at being a part of so many journeys and stories, so many times of happiness at weddings, and sharing sorrow at other times. And baptisms, celebrating new life.

Do You Have a Spare Hot Water Urn?


Our church is looking for another hot water urn after the last one sprang a leak. Before we buy one, I thought I would ask if anyone has one that they don't need any more.


Volunteers are asked to bring gardening gloves to wear.
