## Carers Sunday

For Carers Sunday, our Scripture reading will be Luke 19:1–10, the story of Zacchaeus, the tax collector. This familiar passage tells of Zacchaeus's remarkable journey from being a man of wealth and social exclusion to someone who opens his heart and home to Jesus. His encounter with Christ leads to a complete change in direction—turning away from self-interest and toward generosity, honesty, and faith.

Zacchaeus's story is one of new beginnings—of finding renewed purpose through meeting Jesus and choosing to live differently. This message connects beautifully with the theme of Carers Sunday, reminding us that our work and daily lives can also be places where God's transforming grace is at work. Whether we are starting out, changing direction, or simply seeking meaning in what we do, Zacchaeus's experience encourages us to welcome Christ into every part of our lives and to discover the joy of serving God through our vocations.

To Those Who Care You are the quiet strength in a restless world, the steady hands that lift others when they fall.

Your kindness is not loud, yet it carries farther than any shout. It grows in every life you touch, a ripple becoming a tide of hope.



## Book Review The Book of Fire by Christy Lefteri



The Book of Fire centres around an English/Greek family, the mother Irini, her husband Tasso and their daughter, Chara. They live a simple life in a tiny Greek village. Irini teaches music, Tasso is a painter who captures their beautiful surroundings in his art.

Their lives change after a property developer starts a fire out of greed to clear a small pocket of land to build a hotel. The fire gets out of control, killing many people, destroying homes and the beautiful forest. People's efforts to escape the flames are thwarted by the inefficiency of the fire brigade,

police and the physical barriers that prevent people's access to the sea.

The devastation caused is unimaginable. The entire lives are lost as the residents who remain deal with their mental and physical scars.

One morning, while out walking Irini sees the man who started the fire propped up against a tree. He is barely alive. She leaves him.

She returns home and starts to write her story, The Book of Fire as a fairy tale or a fable hoping to give it a happy ending. This she writes in the third person intertwining it with the present events in a then and now style.

The book is about how climate change is affecting communities, about greed and blame and guilt, about humanity and what it means to give back in times of need. It is beautifully written.

Book Club members scores ranked from 6 to 9 with an average of 7.25.
