

# Hope Like a Dancer by Lauren Wright Pittman Inspired by Matthew 11:1-11 Gouache, paint pens, coloured pencils, and ink on paper

John the Baptist was thrown in prison after publicly questioning the legality of Herod's marriage (Matthew 14:3-5). He was not afraid to go toe-to-toe with the

powerful, and perhaps he expected Jesus' ministry to look more confrontational and politically strategic. In questioning Jesus, I wonder if John sought a particular answer to hang his hope on, that maybe the Messiah would be how he'd imagined him. Maybe Jesus would bust him out of jail and take things straight to Herod, but Jesus offers something else.

In this image, John sits in prison, letting the disciples' testimony settle in. People with hearing, visual, and physical impairments experience new senses and mobility. Those with skin diseases are cleansed. Those with little material comfort are offered irrepressible hope, and the lungs of the dead are filled with the breath of life. I decided to image this good news through the dancing light of a lantern in John's prison cell. I chose dancing figures because dancing feels like a primal response to the radical healing taking place outside the prison walls. As these six dancers illuminate the cell, I imagine John, even if for a moment, breaking into a bit of laughter at the magnitude of Jesus' ministry.

Jesus was quite literally doing the unimaginable. He was removing barriers so that the marginalized were no longer reduced to begging and sitting on mats, shoved to the edges of society. He was not only healing physical ailments; perhaps more importantly, he was restoring people to community. Out of all the miraculous actions mentioned, the news did not include "release of the captives" (Luke 4:18-19). With this message, John would know that he was not going to be freed, and so, the number of dancers would remain one short of seven. As we know all too well, God's work isn't completed in Jesus' time. We are still woefully short of realizing the fullness of God's desire for all of creation, and the work is ours to see through. Until then, let us keep our eyes peeled for the glimmers of hope dancing all around us and work toward a day when all can join in that dance of wholeness.



Rev Mitchell Garlett, where we will hear the importance of this for Aboriginal people. Rev Ken Sumner, UAICC South Australia, will share with us the story of Congress, the joys and challenges. In the afternoon, there will be a variety of workshops facilitated by members of Congress and the Covenanting Commission to explore our theme from different perspectives.

## Keynote Speakers

#### Len Yarran

Len Yarran, a member of Congress, is a Wadjak Noongar elder who has worked extensively in education and devoted much of his life in assisting the local aboriginal men's community in Balga WA. He has gained outstanding recognition for his work in improving the health and wellbeing of local Aboriginal boys and men. Len is part of the team that founded Wadjak Northside, a resource centre and community group dedicated to improving indigenous lives in the northern suburbs of Perth.

#### Ken Sumner

Rev Ken Sumner is a Kukabrak/Ngarrindjeri korni (man) from the Moorundi (River Murray), Mungkanbuli (Lakes), Kurangk (Coorong) & Yarluwar (Southern Ocean) in South Australia.

Ken is a Minister of the Word and is currently employed as the State Development Officer for the Uniting Aboriginal & Islander Christian Congress in South Australia (UAICC-SA). He has served the UAICC & UCA in the South Australian Synod, Vic/Tas Synod & Northern Synod. He has served as Chairperson of the National UAICC. He says that, "he continues to learn".

At our recent congregational meeting a question was raised about how the congregation can be better informed about those you are unwell or asking for prayer. While for privacy reasons we are limited in the information we

This is a ministry of our church that everyone can participate in, whether you pray while walking or pray in your nursing home. I encourage all members to email me and request to be added to the prayer chain so you too can hear about those who are asking for prayer in our community.

If you have any requests for prayer, please email me, call me, or catch me at worship and I will ensure they are included in the next email (or sooner if it is urgent). If you are asking for prayer for someone else, please ensure they are happy for the request to be included and what information they would like shared. Ultimately, everyone is entitled to have information about their physical and mental wellbeing kept private if they wish.

If you have further concerns about an individual member of the congregation, please reach out to their carer. You can find out who this is in our family directory or from the office.
